- Nationally, about 45% of those experiencing homelessness are employed.
- In 2022 HUD PIT count reported 1,389 homeless in South Dakota with 458 in Rapid City.
- 2.8% of Rapid City's children are homeless.

Public Transportation

- Rapid Ride only runs from 6:20am-5:50pm M-F and 9:50am-4:40pm on Saturday with very limited routes and schedules.
- Rapid City School System does not provide busing to any High School students, regardless of location.
- Rapid Ride does not go to Western Dakota Tech, BHSU-Rapid City, or many work locations.

Welfare Queen Stereotype:

- Average monthly welfare payment (TANF) for 1 parent with 2 children is \$484.81; any increases vary by household.
 - o The average time on TANF is 4.3 months
- Federal Food Stamp Benefit is a maximum of \$4.40 per person per day = less than \$1.50 per meal
 - Average food stamp (SNAP) payment is \$4.16 per person per day = \$1.38 cents per meal
 - o Average time receiving food stamps is 8.6 months.
